

U.T. ADMINISTRATION OF DAMAN & DIU
ACHIEVEMENTS & ACTIVITIES UNDER MAJOR
DEVELOPMENTAL SCHEMES

(For the period April, 2013 to November, 2013)

The Union Territory Administration is committed towards providing an inclusive development to the population residing in the territory. A number of schemes for creation and upgradation of physical infrastructure and towards improving the socio-economic status of the citizens are being implemented by the U.T. Administration. The progress in this regard during the period April, 2013 to November, 2013 is highlighted below.

A. New Initiatives

- The Administration has implemented a landmark IT project with effect from 7th May, 2013 of providing time bound services to the public through “*SamaySudhiniSeva*”. SamaySudhiniSeva provides a mechanism to monitor the timely delivery of citizen services by using information technology. SamaySudhiniSeva ensures public service guarantee and also facilitates the efficient implementation of the right of citizens to time-bound delivery of services. It features an online monitoring system which captures the submission of service applications and their disposal electronically through central software based in NIC, Delhi. The scheme also provides for redressal forums in terms of first appellant and second appellant authorities wherein the citizens can register their grievances if their service is not delivered on time. The scheme was first launched with 31 services across 5 departments in Daman. The second phase was launched on 17th July 2013 by adding 21 services of 7 departments in Daman. The service was also launched in Diu. The total services presently available under the Seva are 52 in Daman & Diu across 11 departments. The scheme has been highly appreciated by the public.

- “*Sarvottam*” project has been implemented in the UT for improvement in quality of education of schools, in partnership with CII Institute of Quality, Bangalore. Under this project, 10 Schools each in Daman and Diu districts have started a time-bound journey towards improvement of quality through the school excellence cluster approach, towards final accreditation by a national level agency, within a period of 18 months. Based on the experience with these schools, more schools are being added to the project in both districts, towards the target of covering all schools of the UT within the next few years.
- The UT Administration formulated a Comprehensive Health Insurance Scheme named “*Sanjeevani Swasthya Bima Yojana*” for all families which are below the poverty line and other poor families with an annual income below Rs. 1 lakh, the premium for which will be borne by the UT Administration. In addition, this scheme will be open for the pensioners and other families who can opt to join the scheme on paying the same premium, as well as over 1 lakh labour employed by the industry. A family up to five units will be enrolled under the health cover i.e. Head of household, spouse and up to three dependents. Medical care would be provided through reputed private hospitals in Mumbai, Surat, Rajkot and Ahmedabad empanelled under the scheme. The covered persons would be provided cashless service by the empanelled hospitals on the basis of a smart card issued to each covered family. The scheme provides an annual health cover of Rs 2 lakhs for each family as well as accidental death/disability cover of up to Rs 1 lakh.
- The new building for Education Hub at Kevdi, Diu including College, Polytechnic and Food & Craft Institute is being designed through an open design competition.
- The first ever Degree College in Diu district with Arts and Commerce stream affiliated to Saurashtra University was started on 10th July, 2013 with an intake of 180 students.
- A new scheme called “*Udaan*” for providing free laptop to students of class 11th and first semester of Diploma Courses in Polytechnic has been

formulated for implementation in 2013-14. Purchase order for laptops has been placed after an open tender process.

- A new “*GyanGaurav Award Scheme*” has been formulated for awarding outstanding students of XII standard and best Higher Secondary Schools in the UT, with the aim of incentivizing better performance from students and schools.
- The first ever Daman Heritage Festival was organized on 15-16th October, 2013 at Dominican Monastery, Fort Area, Daman with living legend of BansuriShriHari Prasad Chaurasiya and Bharatnatyam exponent Ms. Rama Vadyanathan performing to packed audiences. This is a new step towards promotion of tourism in the UT.

B. Progress under Infrastructural Developmental Works :

(i) Ongoing major works of Roads, Bridges, Electricity, Water Supply, Fisheries etc. during April, 2013 to November, 2013:

- Constructions of two bridges at Patalia and Bamanpuja at a cost of Rs.21 crore continues and are expected to be completed in the next three to five months.
- The proposals of the following two bridges has already been submitted for approval of SFC (Standing Finance Committee) of the Ministry of Road Transport & Highways:
 - (a) Construction of bridge from Magarwada, Moti Daman to Kachigam, Nani Daman across river Damanganga at the estimated cost of Rs.65 crore.
 - (b) Construction of bridge with approaches across Damanganga river connecting Kachigam and Zari at an estimated cost of Rs.42 crore.
- Construction of Bridge on Coastal Highway from Moti Daman to Nani Daman. DPR has been received.
- Construction of Bridge from Vanakbara, Diu to Kotda, Gujarat. DPR is under preparation.

- Construction of Tad Bridge at Diu. DPR is under preparation.
- The Detailed Project Report for the cable stayed bridge, which will cost about Rs.102 crore, has been prepared.
- The design of a new bridge for Coastal Highway on Damanganga has been completed and has been sent to IIT Delhi for vetting.
- The tender process for construction of the new parallel Ghoghla bridge has been completed, and work at a cost of around Rs. 35 crore is being awarded.
- Strengthening and widening of roads and building works at a cost of over Rs.165 crore is also in progress in both districts.
- Construction of head office and central store building of electricity department has been started at a cost of Rs.14 crore.
- The water pipeline projects to bring water from Madhuban Dam to Dabhel, Dunetha and Magarwada are in progress at a cost of Rs. 49 crore.
- The project for underground sewerage system for Moti Daman has already been sanctioned and tender is to be invited by Daman Municipal Council.
- A new 66/11 KV Sub-Station with a capacity of 30 MW is under construction at Kachigam/Zari at a cost of Rs.9.1 crore and is likely to be completed by January, 2014.
- The capacity of Magarwada Sub-Station is being enhanced from 160 MVA to 220 MVA at a cost of Rs. 9.78 crore.

(ii) New Major Works started during April, 2013 to November, 2013:

- Construction of Lekha building for accounts office, multi-purpose office building at Bhenslore and a new building at Circuit House, Nani Daman at the cost of Rs.11.40 crore.
- The Water Treatment Project at Dunetha has been started at a cost of Rs.17 crore and expected to be completed by middle of next year.
- Consultant appointed for projects of around Rs.40 crore for increasing

water treatment capacity at Dabhel and Magarwada water treatment plant.

- Work of augmentation of water supply to Diu from Sardar Sarovar Dam awarded at a cost of around Rs.35 crore and is expected to be completed by middle of 2015.
- To improve infrastructure for fisheries sector, fishing platforms/jetties of 431 meters length are under construction at a cost of Rs.6.25 crore in various villages of Diu.
- Transit Hostel for visiting Doctors is under construction at Diu at the cost of Rs. 87.01 lakhs.
- New Cricket Pavilion & Stadium at Padmabhusan Sports Complex, Diu.
- Construction of new school building for Government Higher Secondary (Girls) at Vanakbara, Diu.
- Construction of new school building at Saudwadi, Diu under Rastriya Madyamik Shiksha Abhiyan (RMSA).
- Construction of additional classrooms in various schools by PWD and District Panchayat.
- Construction of additional quarters for Government Officers / Officials in both districts.
- Construction of Cycle Track from Hotel Kohinoor to Malala junction and from Govt. House Malala to Kevdi junction along the MDR at Diu.
- Construction of additional 30 bedded facility at Government Hospital, Daman.
- Construction of Coastal Jetty, Diu.
- Construction of "Heritage Walk Way" at Chandrikamata Temple at Jallandhar Beach, Diu (Phase-II).

(iii) Major Works completed during April, 2013 – November, 2013:

- Construction of Coastal Highway connecting Bamanpuja to Ambavadi, Moti Daman.

- Construction of additional block at Government Middle School, Marwad, Daman.
- Replacement of Water Supply pipeline from Somnath to Kachigam, Daman.
- Construction of Check Dam at Kalairiver, Moti Daman.
- Construction of Raktdan Kendra (Component Separation Unit) at Government Hospital, Marwad, Daman.
- The PHC Kachigam has been made operational on 24x7 basis.
- A new OPD Block has been commissioned in Government Hospital, Daman.
- "Heritage Walk Way" at Chandrikamata Temple at Jallandhar Beach, Diu (Phase 1).
- Floating Jetty for PANIKOTHA (Fortim do Mar), Diu.
- Synthetic Badminton Court at Sports Complex, Diu.

C. Progress under Individual beneficiaries Oriented Schemes during April, 2013 to November, 2013:

A number of schemes for the benefit of individuals are being implemented by the Administration, in which assistance in cash/kind is being provided by way of scholarship, pension, subsidy, loan, advances etc. The progress in this regard in various sectors during the period April, 2013 to November, 2013 is as follows:

(i) Crop Husbandry

- Free supply of pesticides, organic fertilizers and Horticulture plants/fruit grafts (100% subsidy) to 1338 farmers.
- Supply of Paddy, Pulses, tools/Implements, Sprayer Pumps, Storage bin set and Agriculture machinery (50 % Subsidy) to 1418 farmers.
- Tractors facility has been provided to 23 farmers on subsidy for Agriculture operations.

(ii) Animal Husbandry

- Subsidy has been provided to farmers for purchase of 24 cross-bred cows under Integrated Dairy Development Project.

(iii) Fisheries

- Provided Safety and Communication equipment to 175 boat owners.
- Subsidy released to the 45 boat owners of Diu District (Rs.54 Lakh) for replacement of kerosene driven OBM engine by LPG driven OBM engine (8- 10 HP) of small traditional fishing boats.
- Financial assistance released to the 57 families of the fisherman affected by natural calamities/accidents and captured by Pakistan Marine Security Agency.
- Subsidy provided to 142 fishermen for purchase of fisheries requisites / equipments.

(iv) Education

- Supply of uniform, textbook, stationery, shoes and socks to 1375 SC students (from Std. 1 to 12).
- Supply of uniform, textbook, stationery, shoes and socks to 4400 ST students (from Std. 1 to 12).
- Release of Post Matric Scholarship to 88 SC students under CSS.
- Release of Post Matric Scholarship to 148 ST students under CSS.
- Provided nutritious food to average 15089 students/month (Std.I to VIII) under Mid Day Meal scheme.

(v) Technical Education

- Stipend Paid for Craft training to the 90 SC/ST youth under TSP (Rs.1000/- per month per beneficiary).

(vi) Labour & Employment

- Stipend paid to 276 trainees under Craftsmen training scheme.
- Boilers suit provided to 215 trainees of ITI, Daman.

(vii) Health

- Financial assistance released to 241 Mothers under “MatruSamrudhhiYojana” @ 5000/- to each beneficiaries.
- LIC JeevanKishor (One time deposit) policy of Rs.40,234/- has been made in the name of 120 girl child under “Dikri Development Scheme” (DDS).

(viii) ICDS

- Provided nutritious food to 7554 Children (06 months to 06 years).
- Provided Foodgrain to 1944 pregnant women & lactating / nursing Mothers.
- Provided nutritious food to 1681 Adolescent Girls – School Going.
- Provided nutritious food to 528 Adolescent Girls – Out of School.

(ix) Rural Development

- Pension released to 2930 old age pensioners, 1709 Widows pensioners and 278 Disabled persons under National Social Assistance Programme.

(x) Urban Development

- Pension released to 1875 old age pensioners, 1947 Widows pensioners and to 252 Disable persons under National Social Assistance Programme.

(xi) Development of SC / ST / OBC

- Cash incentive released to 2400 parent of SC / ST boy students and 2200 parent of SC / ST girl students.
- Cash award released to 513 meritorious SC/ST girl students.

D. Organisation of important Events during April, 2013 to November, 2013:

A number of schemes are being implemented for organization of tours, workshops, seminars etc. The progress in this regard is given below:

- Training has been organized for farmers and for Cooks of Mid Day Meal in which 625 beneficiaries were trained.
- Training of Link Workers on various models for improvement of NRHM service delivery was organized.
- Science Exhibition, Teacher training and Study Tour have been organized and 300 trainees were trained.
- World Health Day was celebrated on 7th April, 2013.
- World Population Day was observed on 11th July, 2013 in which “Run against Population Explosion” was main slogan.

- National Statistics Day has been celebrated on 29th June, 2013.
- Anti Malaria Month was organized from 1st June, 2013 to 30th June, 2013.
- Input Survey of Agriculture 2011-12 was conducted during August, 2013 to September, 2013.
- Sixth Economic Census; 2013, work was taken up and Field work, Scrutiny and Coding work has been completed.
- Field work of Breed Survey was completed and Schedules have been forwarded for data entry at Bangalore.
- Field work of Crop estimation survey was completed.
- Teachers day was celebrated on 5th September, 2013.
- Hindi Fortnight and Hindi day on 14th September, 2013 was celebrated.
- International day of Non Violence was celebrated on 2nd October, 2013.
- Children Day was celebrated on 14th November, 2013.
- Vigilance Awareness week was celebrated from 28th October, 2013 to 3rd November, 2013.

E. Law and Order:

- Complete communal harmony and peace maintained in the U.T. Law and order kept under control.
- Recruitment of 126 constables, including 27 lady constables, completed.
- 9 Head Constables granted promotion to the rank of Assistant Sub-Inspector.
- Automatic License Plate Recognition has been procured to be placed in Daman at various borders, entry and exit points for security purpose.
- CCTV Cameras installed at vulnerable places in the U.T.

F.VIP Visits:

- **Visit of the Hon'ble Union Home Minister**

The Hon'ble Union Home Minister, ShriSushilkumarShinde visited Daman on 27th April, 2013 to review the status of various projects in the UT. The Hon'ble Union Minister was accompanied by Shri K. K. Pathak, Joint Secretary (UT) and ShriAmit Kumar Kaushik, OSD.

He was received at the Daman Airport by the Administrator of Daman and Diu & Dadra Nagar Haveli, and senior officers of the Administration and Indian Coast Guard. The Hon'ble Minister was given the Guard of Honour by the UT Administration on his arrival.

The Hon'ble Union Minister held a meeting with Senior Officers of the Administration. A brief presentation covering the activities of the Administration was given by the Administrator and important issues requiring the attention of MHA were flagged.

- **Visit of the Hon'ble Minister of State for Home Affairs, ShriMullappallyRamachandran.**

The Hon'ble Minister of State for Home Affairs, ShriMullappallyRamachandran visited Daman & Dadra Nagar Haveli on 2nd – 3rd April, 2013.

During his visit the Hon'ble Minister of State for Home Affairs laid down the foundation stone for 30 bedded additional facilities at Government Hospital, Marwad. The Hon'ble Minister also held a meeting with the senior officers of the UT Administration at Daman which was followed by a meeting with the elected representatives from Daman & Diu and Dadra & Nagar Haveli.

- **Visit of the Sub-Committee of Parliamentary Standing Committee on Home Affairs.**

The Sub-Committee on the Administration of Union Territories of the Department related Parliamentary Standing Committee on Home Affairs made a visit to UT of Daman & Diu and Dadra & Nagar Haveli on 05th– 06th November 2013 to review the implementation of various schemes.

The Hon'ble Committee members visited the various projects in order to take stock of the status of implementation of projects/schemes and programmes undertaken by the Administration. The Sub-Committee also had a detailed meeting with the Administrator and senior officers of the Administration on 6th November, 2013.
